Lancashire County Council have asked us to share this information with our families and to invite you to take part in the consultation.

In November 2023, the Government announced it would be willing to enter into a devolution deal with Lancashire County Council, Blackburn with Darwen Council and Blackpool Council. The deal, if given final approval, will transfer new money and powers from central Government to a newly created Combined County Authority, allowing it to tackle key local priorities.

We want to hear from as many people in Lancashire as possible about the draft devolution proposal. A consultation will run until 26 January 2024. Anyone who lives or works in Lancashire, as well as businesses and other interested parties can give their feedback. The consultation is your chance to learn about the proposal, understand how it could affect the region, and have your say. Gathering your views and ideas is important to us, to make sure the deal meets the aspirations and priorities of the county. Please can you forward this to your families or young people to complete.
